



ASIAN YOUTH FORUM '11 MANILA, PHILIPPINES



This year the Asian Youth Forum (AYF) with its theme "Reaching Out" was held in the Philippines and was hosted by the Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Pasig (PLP) and supported by its President, Dr. Amihan April Alcazar and the City Government of Pasig.

The event was participated by delegates from 9 Asian countries: Philippines, Vietnam, Russia, Japan, Cambodia, Bangladesh, Indonesia, Myanmar and India. This convention of students was a week - long event that encouraged each delegate to share their culture and participate in all academic discussions, immersion in an indigent community and leadership training which sought to promote international friendship and social awareness. The delegates arrived in Manila and were accommodated in Pasig Youth Development Center that served as their home for the duration of their stay. Delegates proudly displayed their national costumes in the parade of nations that took everyone in awe.








As a breaker, delegates and the rest of the advisers experienced a fun session with some members of the Portrait Artist Club where in delegates were made as subjects.

All of them were exposed to the ways of the simple life of the tribal community.

The last night of the immersion was made memorable by the Mangyan tribe. They prepared a program wherein they demonstrated local rituals and practices. Young Mangyans treated them with local native songs which was a delight for all. Bonfire lightened up the event. This is their way of saying thank you to all who visited them.









On the last leg of the immersion, delegates spent one night in San Lorenzo Ruiz Academy of Calapan City. Teaching students reading and math took place and a special day wherein the delegates gamely showcased their talents in singing, dancing and role playing to the delight of both students and school staff. Awarding of certificate was done the day after and its off to Manila again for the participants. To signal the end of the week-long event, closing ceremony was held at Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Pasig (PLP).
